In 2009, 28th of November in Geneva, Switzerland, organisers including Unions and Switzerland's Green Party called to peaceful protest against the a three-day WTO conference. In the middle of the demonstration black masked

protesters in the main crowd rampaged through the center of the city and smashed the windows of banks, shops and cafes in central Geneva and set cars on fire.

It was an event you would always remember but most remarkable factor was when black masked demonstrators moved away from the place, in only 5 minutes there was small cars and lots of cleaners cleaning the space as soon as possible and only in 15 minute you would have not guess if anything happened in the city. This picture is a document of one of the broken windows of the Credit Suisse Bank that we can have as a proof.

# 6 - Wet circle Performance

From the beginning we had an idea for a performance: we would sit in a circle and spit, one after the other, in each other's faces, until we all ran out of saliva. It was mysterious act for us. We liked the idea and at the same time we found it scary. Then we understood that this work spoke about our pain, aggression, love, trust, about our collaborative work and the nature of that collaboration, and about our need to take risks...
